BABY CARRIER AND THE PRAM ARE CONVENIENT BUT.....!

A few days ago, I was standing at the gate of our school. Standing there to greet children coming into school, is one of the most exciting things I enjoy doing; the tiny children in tiny shirts and skirts, remind me of how tiny I must have been when I was at their age. Most of the time my greeting is directed to them, but sometimes parents are on the list.

One morning, I was at my routines; *"Good morning parents"* I said, only one answered back, which gave me the opportunity to pick up a conversation with them all. *"You must be making great sacrifices to bring your children every day to school"* I said, one parent replied: *"yes we bring them to school because at home they learn nothing, but at school, they learn everything!"*

In the statement *'at home they learn nothing at school they learn everything'* I noticed the problem that is eating away the fabric of family relationships namely the lack of bonding which comes through interaction. Children identify family members from the day they are born through body contact. They realise that mum is the source of food, movement from place to place, and fast responder if attention is needed.

Carrying babies in a car, sitting around the house or in the pram instead of in the mother's arms is convenient, but it robs the baby of the art of bonding with the mother and other family members from the start of life. There is an increasing loss of closeness between parents and children these days for lack of body contact from earliest time of development. The TV, computers, earphones, house pets, working at home, are slowly eroding the art of conversation and storytelling in our children. It is important that we reflect on the kind of life they will live if they cannot hold meaningful conversation or if they miss to develop attachment to their parents and family. Please do not use the phone or any electronic gadget as a means of keeping your child calm, instead teach them to have one-to one interaction with you. It will pay off later in life.
